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


SUBJECT: Joint Duty Credit for Individuals Completing the Rapid Analytic Support and Expeditionary Response

In the past certain provisions and agreements were made for the Rapid Analyst Support and Expeditionary Response (RASER) program to allow RASER participants to qualify for joint duty credit upon successful completion of the program as an exception to the grade level restrictions outlined in Intelligence Community Directive 601 and Intelligence Community Policy Guidance 601.1.

The RASER program is no longer active, and hence there are no continuing participants. In order to ensure that all individuals who have completed RASER receive joint duty credit as previously agreed, I am directing that claims for credit be submitted by July 31, 2012, using the normal claim procedures of their employing element. All claims submitted by those who have completed RASER, with valid documentation proving successful completion of the program, will be granted joint duty credit, regardless of grade. This will ensure ample opportunity for all deserving candidates to apply for and receive joint duty credit.
